We're all familiar with the old song, but how many of us make the effort to mend or recycle rather than buy new?

With approximately 350,000 tonnes of clothing worth around £100 million going to UK landfill sites every year, it is time to think about the true cost of our attitudes to wards clothing. The environmental costs are considerable - increasing landfill and greenhouse gas emissions which contribute to global warming.

Mending or recycling unwanted clothes can make a real difference. Stitch, glue, dye and patch up are your best options to make a piece of clothing go that little bit further. If this is not possible, please take old, unwanted clothes to your local clothes bank at Scarning Primary School.

After they are collected from the banks, clothes are sorted and those suitable for re-use are exported to Africa. Damaged items are taken for reprocessing, pulped down and recycled into fibre based material. No waste, no environmental cost and a positive social benefit! Please don't put clothes in your black recycling bin - although we have increased the range of materials we recycle, we are not yet able to accept clothes and any put in your black bin will end up in landfill.

A Village at War

There are twelve names on the war memorial outside Scarning Church. These were the men from the village who died in the First World War.

On 23 April 1917, George Payne, a labourer's son was killed at Arras in northern France. He was nineteen. He was one of more than 150,000 men who died in the offensive mounted by the Allies that spring.

On the first day of the offensive the British advanced three and a half miles. An officer wrote that the attack was 'a grand success,' adding that 'to win a battle was a new experience for me.'

Another Scarning man to lose his life at Arras was Private Harry Hunt. The Hunt family lived in one the Hall cottages, opposite the church. Hunt's father worked at Park Farm in the village.

Harry's older brothers were both farm workers, like their father, but Harry took a different direction. He enlisted in the army, joining the 1st Surrey Regiment. One of his relations on his mother's side had fought in the Boer War and he might have been inspired by tales of war. A photograph shows the proud young soldier in his uniform.

Harry Israel Hunt was killed on 4 May 1917. His body, like that of George Payne, was never found.


Both men are remembered on the Arras Memorial.

All proceeds will be donated to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, which is responsible for maintaining the graves of those men who died in the war, both at home and abroad.

Scarning Conservation Volunteers Nature Notes

Although this is the start of the year for many things connected with nature, work on the meadows is drawing to a close.

We have done most of the cutting and clearing of dead plant material and the area is ready for the new growth which is already showing.

We have coppiced some hazels and willows and used the poles to fill in gaps in the hedge at the back of Lucy's Meadow North.

The construction of two new information boards is well underway.

The volunteers were very disappointed to see that one of the nest boxes that we put up near the little children's play area had been forcibly removed from the tree and taken away.

This means that the volunteers time and effort in raising the funds to pay for the box and time taken to obtain and fit it has been wasted and more importantly there is one less home available for the birds.

We try to put the nest boxes in visible places where people can get the maximum enjoyment of seeing them in use.

As well as nesting birds look out for newt, frogs and toads using the scrapes to lay their eggs and for the bright yellow flowers of the marsh Marigolds.
